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Dr. Timothy E. Wilens is chief of the Division of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH), and (co) director of the Center for Addiction Medicine at MGH. He is an associate professor of Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School.

Dr. Wilens earned his BS in literature, science, and arts at the University of Michigan Honors College and his MD at the University of Michigan Medical School in Ann Arbor. His residency in child, adolescent and adult psychiatry was completed at Massachusetts General Hospital under the auspices of Harvard Medical School. He is triple board certified in child/adolescent, adult, and addiction psychiatry.

Dr. Wilens' research interests include the relationship among attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), bipolar disorder, and substance use disorders, and the pharmacotherapy of ADHD across the lifespan. He has published more than 300 peer-reviewed articles, concerning these and related topics, in prestigious journals such as *JAMA*, *American Journal of Psychiatry*, *Archives of General Psychiatry*, and *Pediatrics*. Dr. Wilens has also coedited/published more than 70 book chapters, 3 books, and 300 abstracts and presentations for national and international scientific meetings.
