Dr. Maxine Jochelson is a board-certified radiologist and the Director of Radiology at BAIC in New York City. She received her medical degree in 1977 from New York Medical College in Valhalla, NY. Following an internship in Internal Medicine in 1978 at Los Angeles County Hospital USC Medical Center in Los Angeles, CA, she continued there to complete a residency in Radiology in 1981. In 1983, she completed a fellowship in Oncologic Imaging at Brigham and Women's Hospital Dana Farber Cancer Institute in Boston, MA.

Dr. Jochelson uses her expertise in breast and cancer imaging to work as a team with her colleagues in oncology to provide specialty care to patients. Her interests lie in the evaluation of new technology for diagnosing and staging breast cancer, as well as in improving the evaluation of treatment response in all tumor types.

In particular, Dr. Jochelson has a research interest in Contrast Enhanced Digital Technology. Along with her colleague Dr. David Dershaw, she has developed a research and clinical program which performed the first bilateral contrast mammograms. Their work was instrumental in obtaining FDA approval for this exciting technology. Dr. Jochelson is also interested in the utility of PET/CT for imaging patients with breast cancer and has coauthored several papers on that topic.
