Sheena K. Aurora completed her medical degree at Christian Medical College in Ludhiana, India. Her postdoctoral training included internships at Christian Medical College; Deaconess Hospital in Cleveland, Ohio; and Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan. Dr. Aurora also completed a residency in neurology (including service as Chief Resident) and a fellowship in headache and neurophysiology at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit.

Dr. Aurora is board certified in neurology, headache management, and electrodiagnostic medicine. She is an active member of several professional societies, serving as Chair of the American Academy of Neurology's Headache Science Working Group; Co-Director of the American Headache Society's Fall Symposium; and member of the Migraine Research Foundation's Medical Advisory Board and the National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke's Working Group. Previously, Dr. Aurora has served on the Headache Masters Program, the Migraine Innovators Program, the Neurology Ambassador Program, the American Headache Society Review Board, and the Primary Care Migraine Partnership; she is also a former Secretary of the American Headache Society. Among Dr. Aurora's many honors, she received the American Association for the Study of Headache's Harold G. Wolff Award for Research in Headache (1999, 2001, 2007) and was selected to *Seattle Magazine's* list of best doctors (2010, 2011).

Dr. Aurora has published more than 70 peer-reviewed manuscripts, most recently in *The Journal of Pain, Headache, Acta Neurologica Scandinavica, and Journal of Neurology, Neurosurgery, and Psychiatry*. She was also one of the principal investigators of the first migraine program project funded by the National Institutes of Health. She lectures internationally on the topics of migraine, headaches, and pain.
