

Eldrin Foster Lewis, MD, MPH



Dr. Lewis is a faculty member in the cardiovascular division at Brigham and Women's Hospital and is an Associate Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School, both in Boston, MA. He received his BS degree in premedicine from Pennsylvania State University and his MD degree from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine, where he won the Joel Gordon Miller Award for community service and leadership. Dr. Lewis earned his MPH degree from the Harvard School of Public Health, also in Boston. He completed training in internal medicine and cardiology at Brigham and Women's Hospital, followed by an additional year of subspecialty training in heart failure and transplantation.

Dr. Lewis was one of the first recipients of the Minority Faculty Development Award, which is a 7-year award given to promising young physicians with research potential. He is currently involved with several large, international clinical trials and, during his career, has accumulated approximately 100 publication credits to his name thus far. Moreover, Dr. Lewis received a grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to study the role of quality-of-life assessment in clinical decision-making in patients with heart failure, and he is also the recipient of several grants from the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

Dr. Lewis is the immediate past Chair of the American Heart Association (AHA) Heart Failure and Transplant Committee and Director of the Cardiology Clerkship for Harvard Medical School students who rotate at Brigham and Women's Hospital. He is also Chair of the AHA Founders Affiliate Research Committee; a representative on the national AHA Research Committee and the Science Advisory and Coordinating Committee; and a member of the AHA Founders Affiliate Board of Directors. Further, Dr. Lewis is a member of the American College of Cardiology (ACC) Heart Failure and Transplant Council and was involved in creating content for the ACC American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM) Board Review.

Dr. Lewis is an international expert in the area of quality of life and heart failure, and he serves on scientific committees to review grants for the AHA and the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Task Force for the Standardization of Definitions for Endpoint Events in Cardiovascular Trials. In addition, he is an Associate Editor for *Circulation: Heart Failure* and serves on the editorial boards of several other journals.
