Philip Raskin, MD, FACP, FACE, CDE received his medical degree from the University of Pittsburgh, School of Medicine, where he also completed a residency in internal medicine. He completed a fellowship in endocrinology, diabetes, and

metabolism at UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas. He is board-certified in internal medicine and endocrinology, diabetes, and metabolism. He is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians and the American College of Endocrinology, and is a Certified Diabetes Educator.

He is the Professor of Medicine in the Department of Internal Medicine and holds the Clifton and Betsy Robinson Chair in Biomedical Research at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas. He is the Director of the Diabetes Clinic at Parkland Health and Hospital Systems. He is the Principal Investigator for 4 NIH-funded multicenter diabetes trials: The Diabetes Control and Complications Trial/Epidemiology of Diabetes Interventions and Complications (DCCT/EDIC); TrialNet; The Glycemia Reduction Approaches in Diabetes: A Comparative Effectiveness Study (GRADE Study); and Vitamin D to Prevent Type 2 Diabetes (D2d Study).

Dr. Raskin is a clinical researcher widely renowned for his work in diabetes, diabetes complications, and diabetes management. He was the Editor of the *Journal of Diabetes and Its Complications* from 1990 to 2011 and has served as a past Editor of *Clinical Diabetes*.

He is widely published in numerous peer-reviewed journals, such as the *New England Journal* of *Medicine, Journal of Clinical Investigation, Diabetes, Diabetes Care, Annals of Internal Medicine,* and *Journal of Diabetes and Its Complications.* He has also authored numerous chapters in clinical text books.
