Ty J. Gluckman, MD, FACC, FAHA, is Medical Director of Clinical Transformation at the Providence Heart and Vascular Institute in Portland, Oregon, and an adjunct faculty member of the Ciccarone Center for the Prevention of Heart Disease at The Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland. Dr Gluckman graduated summa cum laude with highest honors from Brandeis University and received his medical degree from Northwestern University Medical School in Chicago, Illinois. He completed his internal medicine training at McGaw Medical Center of Northwestern University, where he remained for additional years as chief resident and an Instructor of Medicine. He completed his cardiology fellowship training at The Johns Hopkins Hospital and served as chief fellow during his final year.

Dr Gluckman's principal clinical interests include identifying, coordinating, and implementing cardiovascular care improvement strategies. He has participated as a principal or coinvestigator for several clinical trials, and has authored or co-authored over 50 peer-reviewed scientific articles, reviews, and book chapters. His work has been published in a number of high-impact journals including *Archives of Internal Medicine*, *JAMA*, *JAMA Cardiology*, the *Journal of the American College of Cardiology*, and the *Journal of the American Heart Association*.

For the last 3 years, Dr Gluckman has led the Interprofessional Practice workshops at the National Cardiovascular Data Registry's (NCDR) annual conference. He also serves as Associate Editor for "Practice Guidelines and Clinical Documents" for ACC.org (the primary web site for the American College of Cardiology [ACC]). Dr Gluckman is a member of the American Heart Association (AHA) and American Society for Preventive Cardiology. He is also an active councilor and Director of Quality for the Oregon Chapter of the ACC and the National Clinical Quality Expert for the ACC Patient Navigator Program. Furthermore, Dr Gluckman is the lead developer for the ACC/AHA "Atherosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease (ASCVD) Risk Estimator," which was selected as the best medical app in 2014. He also helped to design the BridgeAnticoag app. Most recently, Dr Gluckman was selected for the Health Management Academy GE Fellows Program for Physician Executives and was named to Cardiology Today's list of "Next Gen Innovators."
