Michael E. Weinblatt, M.D. is a graduate of the University Of Maryland School Of Medicine, (1975). He completed his internship and residency in Internal Medicine at the University of Maryland Hospital in Baltimore. He was a Rheumatology Fellow at the Robert Breck Brigham Hospital and Harvard Medical School in Boston. For the past 37 years he has been at the Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston where he currently serves as the R. Bruce and Joan M. Mickey Distinguished Chair in Rheumatology and is the John and Eileen K. Riedman Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School.

Dr. Weinblatt's major research interest is in the study of therapeutics for Rheumatoid Arthritis.. In recognition of his research accomplishments he has received the Virginia P. Engalitcheff award from the National Arthritis Foundation for impact on quality of life (shared with Dr. Alarcon, Dr. Hoffmeister, and Dr. Kremer for their work on methotrexate), the Carol Nachman Prize from Germany, the American College of Rheumatology Distinguished Clinical Investigator award, the University of Maryland School of Medicine Alumni Association Honor Award and Gold Key for Outstanding Contributions to Medicine and the American College of Rheumatology Presidential Gold Medal. He was elected a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians (UK) and a Master of the ACR.

He served as President of the ACR in 2001. He was associate editor for *Arthritis Rheumatism* and currently serves as an advisor to *Arthritis and Rheumatology* on their clinical trials section. He has an extensive bibliography and serves as co-editor for the textbook *Rheumatology*.
