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Corey A. Siegel received his medical degree from Tufts University School of Medicine in Boston, Massachusetts. Dr. Siegel's research interests include understanding risk/benefit tradeoffs in IBD, developing models to predict outcomes in Crohn's disease, and creating tools to facilitate shared decision-making for IBD patients.
