He completed an internship in the department of medicine at the Indiana University Hospital in Indianapolis, Indiana. He also completed a residency in psychiatry as well as a fellowship in consultation-liaison psychiatry at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Dr. Mitchell serves on the editorial boards of the *International Journal of Eating Disorders* and *Surgery for Obesity and Related Diseases*. He has written over 500 scientific articles and is author, co-author, or editor of 18 books.

Dr. Mitchell has received the Lifetime Achievement Award for Research in Eating Disorders from the Academy for Eating Disorders, the National Eating Disorders Coalition Award for Research Leadership, and the Research Award from the Eating Disorders Research Society.
