Dr. Alvarez completed an internal medicine & medical oncology residency at Centro Oncológico de Excelencia in Gonnet, Argentina, as well as a residency in internal medicine at the University of Texas Health Science Center UTHealth Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences in Houston, Texas. He the completed a fellowship in hematology/oncology at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston. Later in his career, he earned a Master of Science in Cancer Biology at the University of Texas Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences in Houston.

Dr. Alvarez's research studies are published in many peer-reviewed journals. He has written more than 100 articles, abstracts and book chapters, and he regularly presents his work at national and international conferences. He currently serves as a clinical assistant professor of medicine at Georgia Regents University in Atlanta, Georgia. Prior to that, he was assistant professor of breast medical oncology at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center, and also served as assistant professor with the Morgan Welch Inflammatory Breast Cancer Research Program and Clinic in Houston, Texas.

Currently, Dr. Alvarez is the medical oncology director for the CTCA Breast Cancer Institute. He is also the medical director of the Breast Cancer Center at CTCA in Atlanta, where he is mainly focused on the treatment of advanced breast cancer and inflammatory breast cancer.
