



Maurie Markman, MD, President Medicine & Science, Cancer Treatment Centers of America

Dr. Markman has more than 20 years of experience in cancer treatment and gynecologic research at some of the country's most recognized facilities. Most recently, Dr. Markman served as the vice president for clinical research and chairman of the Department of Gynecologic Medical Oncology at MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas, where he also served as a professor of medicine. Prior to that, Dr.

Markman spent 11 years as chairman of the Department of Hematology/Oncology and director of the Taussig Cancer Center at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation. He also spent five years as vice chairman of the Department of Medicine at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in New York.

Dr. Markman completed an internship and residency in internal medicine at the New York University Medical Center Bellevue Hospital in New York, New York, where he was named chief resident in his final year. He then completed fellowship training in hematology and oncology at both the National Cancer Institute and Johns Hopkins University (Sidney Kimmel Comprehensive Cancer Center) in Maryland. Dr. Markman also holds a master's degree in health policy & management from the New York University Graduate School of Public Administration, and a graduate certificate of advanced study in bioethics from the Department of Philosophy at Cleveland State University in Cleveland, Ohio.

Dr. Markman has published more than 1400 articles, editorials, peer-reviewed manuscripts, book chapters, reviews, letters and abstracts. He has also written or co-edited 10 books. Currently, Dr. Markman is president of Medicine & Science at Cancer Treatment Centers of America. Previously, he was senior vice president of clinical affairs and national director of medical oncology at CTCA.
