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Beth-Ann has been involved in the care of patients with IBD as a nurse practitioner since 1999. She has cared for IBD patients from a surgical perspective while working in the Division of Colon and Rectal Surgery at Brigham and Women's Hospital Boston and from the medical and nutritional perspective at the Crohn's and Colitis Center at the Massachusetts General Hospital, at the Dr. Henry D. Janowitz Division of Gastroenterology at the Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York City, and now at the BWH Crohn's and Colitis Center. Beth-Ann has been an investigator in numerous clinical trials, published articles in peer-reviewed journals, and is a frequent speaker on IBD.

Beth-Ann is a professional member of the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation (CCF) and the one of the few non-surgeons granted membership in the American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons. She has served on the CCF Professional Education Committee and on the CCF Nurse Task Force Committee from 2009 to 2011. She is currently a member of the Northern New England Chapter of the CCF Medical Advisory Committee, one of the few non-physician providers on the committee. She is a member of the Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing. Beth-Ann was honored by the Northern New England Chapter of the CCF in 2011 as one of the "Ten Who Shape the Future."
