Gregory P. Hess, MD, MBA, MSc

Gregory P. Hess, MD, MBA, MSc, practices clinically at the Community Volunteers in Medicine (CVIM) Clinic in West Chester, PA and teaches at Drexel University College of Medicine in Philadelphia, PA. He received his medical degree from Albany Medical College, a master of science degree in health services research at Erasmus University, Netherlands, and a master of business administration degree from the Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania. Dr Hess's fellowships include his selection to the White House Fellows and the US Japan Leadership program, serving as the first Senior Fellow at the Institute for Health Economics and Policy, Tokyo, Japan. In his clinical practice, he has served as an assistant professor at Georgetown University, an associate professor at Emory University, team physician for the US Alpine Ski Team, and board member for the Kerr White Institute for Health Services Research at Emory.

Dr Hess focuses his research on the creation of very large, integrated patient-level analytical platforms, and the conduct of retrospective, real-world studies with a broad range of collaborating investigators and organizations. Most recently, Dr Hess served as executive vice president and chief medical officer at Symphony Health. During that time, he also chaired the American Society of Clinical Oncology's Data Analytics Committee for CancerLinQ®, and was an investigator on a range of studies with the NIH, CDC, FDA, American College of Cardiology, and The Scientific Registry of Transplant Recipients, as well as pharmaceutical-sponsored research.
