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Carlos de Castro, MD, is a Professor of Medicine at Duke University in the Division of Hematologic Malignancies and Cellular Therapy, Department of Medicine and a member of the Duke Cancer Institute. His clinical research focuses on treatments for bone marrow failure conditions such as paroxysmal nocturnal hemoglobinuria (PNH), aplastic anemia, myelodysplastic syndromes, and acute leukemias. Dr. de Castro has served in several roles at Duke including Medical Director of the 9100 Malignant Hematology Ward, Medical Director of the Apheresis Unit, and Program Director of the Duke Hematology-Oncology Fellowship Program.
