April Hazard Vallerand, PhD, RN, FAAN, is currently the College of Nursing Alumni Professor in the College of Nursing at Wayne State University. She is also the Interim Associate Dean for Research and the Interim Director of the PhD Program. Her research interests are focused on the improvement and maintenance of functional status in patients with chronic pain and the identification and reduction of pain-related disparities. She is the Principal Investigator for a study titled, *Improving Functional Status in African Americans with Cancer Pain*, funded by the National Cancer Institute.

Dr. Vallerand is a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing. She lectures nationally on the management of pain and has published numerous articles on pain and pain control. Dr. Vallerand has also authored 5 books on pharmacology for nurses and other health care professionals, including *Davis's Drug Guide for Nurses*, which is in its 13th edition. Dr. Vallerand received her Bachelor's Degree in Nursing from Mount St. Mary's College in Los Angeles, California, her Master of Science in Nursing from California State University, Los Angeles, and her PhD in Nursing from the University of Pennsylvania, before completing a 3-year postdoctoral fellowship in Psychosocial Oncology at the University of Pennsylvania School of Nursing.
